SUBJECT: 2017 Calvary Graduate Survey

The following report is the result of the 2017 Graduate Survey. The survey was administered to graduating students prior to commencement using Google Docs. All graduating students were asked, by email, to participate. Out of 38 graduates, 34 submitted surveys for a response rate of 89.47%. These results are provided so that they may be incorporated to guide decision making for institutional and departmental changes, and for use in 2017 department assessment reports.




