I. DESCRIPTION

An applied class on the fundamentals of voice or instruments.

Group instruction for voice or instruments. The student is required to attend all General Recitals and the music event during the semester of the private lessons.

*Applied Group Music Lesson Fee: \$30 per credit hour

*Accompanist Fee for Voice Students: none

II. OBJECTIVES

The intent of group lessons is to enhance your technical ability to use your instrument in healthiest manner possible, to encourage musical growth, and to aid in progression of your artistic musicianship.

III. REQUIREMENTS

Each student will be required to take 13 group lessons and attend 2 Performance Workshops per semester. *Students enrolled for one cycle will be required to take 6 group lessons and attend 1 Performance Workshop.

Group lesson time will be determined during the first week of school.

Each student will attend a weekly group lesson and should practice daily.

Student is required to attend all General Recital and Calvary University Music events.

One absence is allowed for 1 credit-hour applied lessons. 2 absences are allowed for 2 credit-hour applied lessons.

Please call or email in advance if you cannot attend a lesson.

If there are no classes (on the school calendar) due to: School Conference, Work day, Day of Prayer, Snow day, etc. make up lessons are not required.

There will be a final exam (Jury), sung from memory.

IV. METHODS

Grades will be given at the end of each lesson each week.

V. MATERIALS

Please ask the professor if you have questions about a particular translation or version.
