## 90 Years of Biblical Education

Calvary University is excited to welcome both incoming and returning students to campus. Josh Johnson, Dean of Men, and Jamie Franz, Dean of Women, have been working to facilitate a campus community rich with discipleship within the dorms.

Ephesians will be the focus for men's and women's Bible study groups this year, emphasizing the workmanship of Christ and how to understand one's identity in Christ. Students can also look forward to new campus improvements and updates. These renovations include new heating and air conditioning systems for the Pyramid Athletic Center and Conference Center, repair and resurfacing of the Student Life Center parking lot, equipment

upgrades and safety updates to the science lab, and—thanks to the 2022 Senior Class—a makeover of the Warrior Cafe. One of the most exciting campus improvements is the installation of new security cameras, ensuring the continued safety of students, faculty, and staff. There are a total of 288 students so far this year, 78 who are new, and Calvary University is eager to provide them with an enriching, biblical education. ■

## Business Leadership Roundtable FEBRUARY 6-7, 2023

Employee turnover is a huge problem in today's workforce, and management often struggles to find ways to retain high-performing employees. Christian businesses and church leaders can address this problem by investing in healthy workplace cultures. Calvary University is seeking to foster progress toward this objective with the emergence of its first Business Leadership Roundtable: "Turning the Great Resignation into the Great Retention!"

This event is designed to assist leaders in a broad spectrum of businesses and ministries by engaging in a conversation on how to move toward better employee retention. The roundtable will also provide an opportunity for business leaders to collaborate and discuss difficult questions. We are excited to see engagement and participation nurture a deeper involvement within our leadership community.

The main topic of employee retention will be broken down into six subtopics: ethics, communication barriers, dealing with difficult people in business, problem solving and risk management, toxic leadership, and dealing with change. Our hope is that our participants will grow in their understanding while addressing subjects such as employee engagement, talent management, coaching, and human capital analytics.

The goal of this conference is two-fold: First, that Calvary would be a place where leaders can engage

in strategic conversations with the biblical worldview in mind; second, that the participants will engage in developing materials and responses that seek to honor God. Ultimately, this inaugural event is designed to encourage Christian business owners and church leaders by addressing biblical leadership.

## Dealing With Conflict Biblically

### Dr. James Clark

Dr. Clark graduated from Calvary Bible College in 1967 with a Bachelor of Science in Christian Education and a minor in Music. Over the next several years, he served as a Youth For Christ director, filled multiple chaplaincy roles, and served as a pastor for churches in both Minnesota and Iowa.

In 1993, Dr. Clark returned to teach at Calvary, having completed a master's and a doctorate degree in Biblical counseling, and started the counseling department for both the college and seminary. At Calvary, he served as an academic dean for eleven years, president for seven years, and is currently teaching as an adjunct professor.

Dr. Clark's journey in ministry began when he was just thirteen




years old: "While attending a Youth For Christ rally in St. Louis, I felt called to ministry. My church gave me opportunities to speak and I preached two summers in churches in Michigan." During his time as a student at Calvary, Dr. Clark served for three years at Kansas City Youth For Christ as a club director, where he discovered his passion for counseling teenagers.

Dr. Clark saw the need for pastors and chaplains who truly desired to provide biblical counseling: "Being called to Calvary to teach counseling and head up a counseling center was a big step in my life; I loved assisting students in their counseling ministry." After retiring, Dr. Clark decided to share his experiences and insight, by writing *Biblical Counseling for the Church and Community*, published through Grace Acres Press.

His most recent publishing endeavor, now available from

Calvary University Press, is *Dealing with Conflict Biblically* which contains wisdom distilled from his experiences dealing with many different types of conflict during his ministry. He states: "It goes without saying that conflict is everywhere. In my book, I present Biblical solutions to conflict, whether personal, interpersonal, emotional, social, or spiritual. How to deal with conflict is clearly laid out in the Bible, which is what I expound upon with illustrations and biblical examples."



Dr. Clark is excited about writing several more books to inspire people to find relevant solutions for modern society in the Bible. "Calvary University Press has great potential to inform people about Biblical material to help them in their understanding, knowledge, and growth in the Lord Jesus Christ!" Dr. Clark continues to enthusiastically pursue God's will in his life by seeking to serve through teaching, preaching, and writing. "I'm enjoying this phase of my retired life. As my physician said, God is not done with the Clarks yet!" ■

## Shrewdness and Faithfulness

*"Therefore if you have not been faithful in the use of unrighteous wealth, who will entrust the true riches to you?"*

This verse, taken from the parable of the unrighteous steward in Luke 16, is startling in many ways.

The unrighteous steward has squandered what belongs to the rich man and is about to be fired.

Desperate, he starts to settle the rich man's accounts by requiring far less than what was owed, further placing the rich man at a loss.

Christ then holds this unrighteous steward up as an example of shrewdness! Crucially, though, this steward is not an example of a far more important trait: faithfulness.

Faithfulness is what is required of us. Being faithful in whatever we do, no matter how small or insignificant, is rewarded—whether it be in financial assets, responsibilities, or wisdom. God is watching and He acts

on behalf of those who honor Him with the resources He has provided.

True riches, riches like redemption, grace, and sanctification come from Christ. However, in this parable, Christ makes it clear that He also expects faithfulness in how we handle temporal blessings. ■

## Alumni Spotlight

### Dr. Jeff Rhoades


Dr. Jeff Rhoades recently published *The Bible, Dimensions, and the Spiritual Realm: Are Heaven, Angels, and God Closer than We Think?* addressing the reliability of biblical teachings on these subjects.

Jeff grew up in Raytown, Missouri and became a follower of Christ in his early twenties. Jeff was married, raising a newborn, and working full-time when he started attending Calvary. "The registrar didn't think I could take enough classes for a degree," Jeff recalls, "But I was new

to the Bible and wanted to take all the classes I could."

Jeff says that his ministry has been a "thousand steps of obedience," stating: "I never set out to be a pastor or a missionary, I set out to serve God." He affirms his education at Calvary was exceptional and that it molded his foundational understanding of the biblical worldview: "I was like a kid in a candy store for the first time. I soaked in the teaching. Little did I know that I would eventually go on staff full-time at Abundant Life Church as Outreach Pastor and then go to El Salvador as a missionary."

Jeff's heart has always been in evangelism and sharing the gospel. During his time in El Salvador, hundreds of men and women were led to Christ as he helped start several churches and build three

church buildings there.

"We also had baptisms in the rivers and pools. I remember we were baptizing several people, and one girl was physically handicapped but wanted to be baptized. We lifted her up out of the chair and carried her to the water, and I was baptized with her as we both went under."

and the *Spiritual Realm* to provide scientific and biblical evidence to show that heaven is a real place with dimensionality. "I've challenged my Sunday school classes to think of heaven as a separate or higher dimension. If God created our spacetime continuum, then He must be in a dimension separate from that which He has created." The book addresses how science supports the Bible's perspective on the reality of the spiritual realm.

When asked about what he is looking forward to in the future, Jeff says he plans to continue serving God with the gifts he has been given, as well as living out God's will for his life by obeying His Word. He plans to fulfill this mission by pointing his audiences to the truth found in God's holy Scriptures: "I will preach and teach the truth, because that is what the Holy Spirit uses to save souls and change lives." ■
