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DESCRIPTION

This course focuses on the biblical and scientific evidences for young earth creationism. Students will study a grammatical-historical interpretation of Genesis 1-11 and explain how the creation-fall-global flood events in history impact the study of astronomy, geology and biology. Students will critique the theory of evolution, evolutionary creation, progressive creation, gap theory and other views of origins and Genesis 1-2.

This course is offered in two formats: in-person and online. Students registered for in-person attend the classes in person, online students attend the classes via the online classroom. For both in-person and online students, assignments and interaction outside of the class period are done in the learning management system.

REQUIRED TEXTBOOKS:

REQUIRED: ORIGINAL LANGUAGE BIBLE STUDY SOFTWARE (Accordance OR Logos)

Students are required to have digital resources to engage Biblical study in the original languages, including but not limited to *Biblia Hebraica Stuttgartensia (BHS)*, *Nestle Aland 28 (NA28)* – both including critical apparatus; Septuaginta (LXX), a Greek Lexicon of the New Testament and Other Early Christian Literature (BDAG) by Bauer, Danker, Arndt, and Gingrich; Hebrew and Aramaic Lexicon of the Old Testament (HALOT) by Koehler and Baumgartner.

ASSIGNMENTS

Assignment 1: Read *The Evolution Controversy* and answer questions 1-10 in Discussions on the book. You must read the answers posted by the other students and ask questions and interact online about their answers to the questions (100 points)

Assignment 2: Read *Glass House: Shattering the Myth of Evolution*. In a Word document indicate that you did the reading of the book and type a list of 10 things you learned from reading the textbook. (100 points)

Assignment 3: Write a biblical and scientific critique of evolutionary creation (once called theistic evolution) (see the BioLogos website for articles to read and critique). This research paper should be 10-12 pages (double spaced) and following Turabian format (with footnotes). (200 points)

Assignment 4: Read *Coming to Grips with Genesis* and answer questions 11-20 in Discussions on the book. You must read the answers posted by the other students and ask questions and interact online about their answers. (100 points)

Assignment 5: Read the book *Searching for Adam* and answer questions 21-30 in Discussions on the book. You must read the answers posted by the other students and ask questions and interact online about their answers. (100 points)

Assignment 6: Write and type a research paper (25-30 pages double spaced following Turabian format) defending biblical young earth creationism. The topic can be selected by the student but must be approved by the professor (200 points)

Assignment 7: Present your research paper in the last class. Students should use Powerpoint slides to communicate. Every student is to post an evaluation/critique of the research paper and presentation in Discussions (week eight) in Canvas (100 points).

Assignment 8: Attendance in class and attendance reports. Students are expected to be in class (in-person and online). In-person students are expected to be in their seats on the day and time that the class meets. Online students are expected to participate in the class in Microsoft Teams on the day and time that the class meets. All students should post their attendance each week in Canvas (seek Week One Attendance Report in Announcements). All students should list three things that they learned from the weekly lecture.

Excused Absence = the student has notified the professor in an email that he or she will not be in class and gives the reason why.
