

On May 7, Calvary University celebrated Commencement for the class of 2022. A large class of ninety-four students graduated this year including twenty-four students with Master's degrees, fifty-nine with Bachelor's degrees, and eleven with Associate's degrees.

In his keynote speech, Dr. Richard Bargas, Executive Director of IFCA International, exhorted the graduates; "Calvary has given you

a greater gift—much more than an excellent education. This school has entrusted you with the knowledge and truth of Jesus Christ. In your time here you have been exposed to the majesty of our Lord, and you must take care not to squander what you have received."



Calvary presented Rev. Thomas (Tom) A. Zobrist with an Honorary Doctorate of Divinity and introduced The Zobrist Family Scholarship for future students who demonstrate a passion for full-time ministry. Tom is an air force veteran who has served faithfully in many ministries, including being a pastor for nearly thirty-five years. After serving for six years in the U.S. Air Force as a B-52 crew chief, he and his wife Cindi were led to Calvary Bible College, where he graduated with a Pastoral degree in 1987. After just one year of internship at a local church, he began pastoring Liberty Bible Church, a small storefront church in Eureka, Illinois, which has now transformed into a lively church home of over 500 members. Since then, Tom has served on the boards of Brazil Gospel Fellowship Mission, Calvary University, Adelphos USA, and the IFCA. Regarding his education at Calvary, Tom reflects: "Calvary gave

me a solid foundation of Bible and theology on which all of the ministry God has given me has been built." Through Tom's faithful service, he has helped prepare a new generation of leaders to serve by building the body of Christ.

Alumnus Recognized

Bruce Baker

Dr. Bruce Baker (CTS '97) and his wife, Bonnie, were married for 40 years and had three children together: Daniel, Jacob, and Elizabeth. Dr. Baker went to be with the Lord on February 13, 2022 from ALS complications.

Dr. Baker served in the US Navy for 11 years until he was honorably discharged in 1991. He dedicated the rest of his life to ministry and preaching the Gospel at various churches and across the globe. He received his Master's of Divinity from Calvary Theological Seminary in 1997 and his Ph.D. in Systematic Theology from **Baptist** Seminary. According to his wife, "his extroverted personality made him a natural teacher and expository preacher, and God allowed him to be a gifted one." Bonnie also said that he hardly ever wasted an opportunity to talk about Christ with those around him.

"During his illness, he never quit telling all of the many doctors, nurses, and aides about their need for a saving relationship with Christ."

In 1999, Dr. Baker went on a mission trip and discovered the impact he could have in teaching pastors and church leaders from across the globe who did not have access to sound biblical teaching. From that point on, for as long as his

health allowed him to, he traveled to over 11 different countries on 4 different continents on an annual basis. In 2007, he took a trip to central Africa which stirred within him a passion and love for the people who lived there. The trip also gave him the idea to start his own organization, called Becoming Mature. Dr. Baker created this organization to help train pastors and church leaders, as well as build churches in central Africa. The Bakers' son, Jacob, is now the Executive Director and Missionaryat-Large for Becoming Mature. Bonnie and their daughter, Elizabeth, also help with the ministry. Bonnie is the Office Manager and Elizabeth is the Online Coordinator. The Baker family hopes to continue expanding the ministry and the work being done in Africa through Becoming Mature.

In the last 12 years, Dr. Baker wrote two books. In 2010, he published *Spiritual Maturity: The Road to Wonderland*. After being diagnosed with ALS in 2018, he wanted to write a book of hope for believers who, like him, would stare death in the face. In 2019, he published *For Thou Art With Me: Biblical Help for the Terminally III and Those Who Love Them*.

According to Bonnie, Dr. Baker's true passion was teaching others about the Lord and the Bible. "When he could no longer preach, it was






a very low point for him." COVID brought about more complications for his desire to teach, as it meant that he was not able to leave home. However, God continued to use and bless Dr. Baker, "He was asked to teach the adult Sunday School class. He would sit at his computer, in front of the camera and God would give him just enough energy to make it through the lesson. But that was enough for Bruce," Bonnie continued, saying, "Even right up to the end of his life, God just kept giving Bruce small, yet vital roles."

Calvary University is delighted to recognize Dr. Baker for his faithful service in ministry. During Calvary's commencement service on May 7th, Bonnie Baker accepted the Alumni Association Award on behalf of her late husband and announced the establishment of the Baker Scholarship in his honor.

The institution that the Lord assigned to give witness to and advance the glories of the Gospel is the church. The local church is the regional manifestation of the people of God and is to be cultivated and protected. **Calvary exists for building up the Body of Christ.** This means that everything we do, both in and out of the classroom, is designed to support and serve the efforts of the local church. We do this because we believe in five essential truths about the church:

First, the church was established as an institution for the glory of God. It was not founded as a way for us to fulfill and exalt ourselves, no, the church exalts God. Although the church must reach out to people in the love of Christ, it must maintain its focus on God.

- **Second**, the church must firmly stand on the absolute authority of Scripture. The Bible and the Bible alone is the standard for all matters relating to faith and practice.
- **Third**, the church must have sound doctrine. The church needs to teach God's Word and challenge believers to adhere to what His Word teaches.
- Fourth, the church must have its members committed to a life of holiness.
- Fifth, the church must understand that Christ is the Head of the church (Eph. 1:22; 4:15) and that He mediates His rule in the church through godly leaders (1 Thess. 5:13-14; Heb. 13:7, 17).

Everything we do, both in and out of the classroom, is designed to support and serve the efforts of the local church.

The Scriptures reveal that the church has two foundational purposes: **First**, edification or ministering to the body. The church comes together as a body of believers who minister to one another. **Second**, evangelism or ministering to the world. The church is to minister the gospel to unbelievers in the world. These two purposes are the foundations of the church.

The early church devoted itself to the purpose of edification, to building one another up in the faith (Col. 3:16).

They accomplished their purpose by faithfully teaching God's Word, fellowshipping, and worshiping. The book of Acts shows us how they steadfastly devoted themselves to the teachings of the apostles. They preached Christ crucified and resurrected and affirmed that He was indeed the Messiah. They taught and exhorted each other to bring every believer into maturity in Christ (Col. 1:25-29). Every believer was encouraged to utilize their spiritual gifts for the edification of the Body. They emphasized fellowship and met the needs of all the believers by sharing things in common (Acts 4:32) and taking care of the widows and orphans (James 1:27). They stood side by side through the trials and tribulations of persecution. They worshipped and gave glory to God together.

The New Testament church did not attempt to carry out its evangelism within the confines of a building but rather out in the world. In obedience to Christ's command for evangelizing the world (Matt. 28:18-20), the church worked in the world to make disciples (learners) and baptize them. The ministry of evangelism was not carried on by a select few for a select few, but it was carried on by ordinary believers for all people, rich or poor. They preached the good news to both Jews and

Let us celebrate Calvary University's unbroken commitment to the vision of being an institution of academic and spiritual excellence that equips servant leaders for Christian service worldwide. Since 1932, our partnership with the local church has produced over nine thousand laborers who have served in all fifty U.S. states and over one hundred countries.
