This course is offered in two formats: in-person and online. Students registered for in-person attend the classes in person, online students attend the classes via the online classroom. ### I. DESCRIPTION

This course covers the fundamentals of fishing as a recreational activity and an outdoor travel skill. This comprehensive instruction is designed to instruct people on the skill set of freshwater fishing.
