Job Summary

The Athletic Director/Men's Basketball Coach is a dual role that combines the responsibilities of leading the university's Athletic Department with coaching the men's basketball team.

Job Responsibilities

Athletic Director:

- Oversee the overall operations of the athletic department, including budget management and compliance with NCCAA and MCCC conference regulations.
- Develop and implement strategic plans for athletic program growth, marketing, and fundraising.
- Provide guidance and support to coaching staff to enhance team performance and development.
- Serve as the primary liaison between the athletic department and university administration, faculty, and staff.
- Ensure that all athletic programs maintain academic integrity and comply with university policies and procedures.
- Coordinate and lead weekly Athletics staff meetings.
- Meet weekly with the President and submit written reports as required.
- Attend weekly Cabinet meetings.
- Serve on committees as assigned.

Men's Basketball Coach:

- Lead the men's basketball team in a Christ-centered environment that emphasizes academic excellence, character development, and athletic achievement.
- Recruit and retain talented student-athletes who demonstrate strong academic and spiritual commitment.
- Develop and implement a comprehensive coaching plan that includes game strategy, player development, and team building.
- Collaborate with the athletic department to ensure compliance with NCCAA regulations and university policies.
- Mentor and coach student-athletes to achieve their academic and athletic goals.
- Mentor and develop assistant coaches and other team staff members.
- Manage team budgets, scheduling, travel arrangements, and equipment needs.

Shared Responsibilities:

- Collaborate with other coaches and staff members to promote the university's athletic program values of excellence, integrity, and servant leadership.
- Participate in campus-wide events and initiatives that promote Christian values and community engagement.
- Ensure compliance with NCCAA rules and regulations.
- Engage in fundraising efforts to support athletic program growth and development.
- Assist with other athletic events and programs as needed.
- Participate in university-wide initiatives and events that promote the university's mission and values.
- Collaborate with other departments on campus to promote campus-wide events and initiatives.
